COMMON NAME	BOTANICAL NAME	LOCATION	DESCRIPTION	TYPE
<b>Angelonia</b>	<i>Angelonia angustifolia</i>	Grow in full sun along the edge of walkways. Prefers regular watering.	Flowers are rose-lilac to violet -blue almost an inch across. Each flower borne on slender upright spike, 12-18" tall on bushy plant. Moderately drought tolerant.	Summer annual used as bedding plant.
<b>Bahama Cassia</b>	<i>Senna mexicana var. chapmanii</i>	Any soil type, part sun, part shade	Native to Florida. Yellow flowers 1/2"-1" that attract many butterflies such as the sulfur.	Upright sprawling shrub 3'-5'
<b>Blue mistflower</b>	<i>Conoclinium coelestinum</i>	Full to part sun. Moist well-draining soil.	Many dense, puffy heads of small, fuzzy lavender-blue flowers, blooms Summer and Fall.	A small annual 1'-2' ground cover in the Aster family and a good nectar plant for butterflies.
<b>Brazilian Blue Buttonbush or Martinique Batchelor's Button</b>	<i>Centratherum intermedium</i>	Full sun, part sun	Lavender-blue thistle like flowers blooms fall, not frost tolerant. Oval, serrated foliage has pineapple fragrance. New stems are covered with hairs. Easy to grow, pest-free. Tends to self seed.	Perennial flowering groundcover
<b>Climbing Rose</b>	<i>Rosa 'Dortmund'</i>	Full sun	Features profuse clusters of fragrant, crimson red, single flowers with white eyes. Blooms freely from late spring to frost. Glossy, dark green foliage. Orange hips.	A climbing or pillar rose which typically grows 8'-10' tall. Can also be grown as a 4'-6' tall freestanding shrub.

<b>Crossandra</b>	<i>Crossandra infundibuliformis</i>	Full sun to semi shade	Dark green glossy foliage with ruffled leaves; flowers usually shaped with asymmetrical petals arising from slender corolla tubes that sprout from 4-sided spikes, fragile flowers easily damaged by rain, otherwise long lasting. Blooms year round.	A low evergreen, perennial tropical shrub.
<b>Downy or Star Jasmine</b>	<i>Jasminum multiflorum</i>	Well drained soil in full sun or partial shade	Fragrant white star like 1/2" flowers. Blooms year round.	Perennial vining, evergreen shrub growing 5-10 feet.
<b>Dwarf Red Powder Puff</b>	<i>Calliandra haematocephala 'Nana'</i>	Full or partial sun, need good drainage	The red flowers are attractive to butterflies and hummingbirds. Flowers most of the year.	Shrub up to 6'
<b>Firecracker</b>	<i>Russelia equisetiformis</i>	Full sun in any soil. Drought tolerant. Sometimes looks weedy.	Profuse blooms of bright, red long, tubular flowers blooming year-round. Drooping stems and narrow linear leaves on plants 6' high. Sprawling habit. Attracts hummingbirds.	Perennial, shrubby and mound forming growth habit.
<b>Key West Morning Glory</b>	<i>Jacquemontia pentantha</i>	Grows in full sun to part shade. Grows well in moist areas.	Funnel-shaped flowers, sky blue with a white throat, averaging just under an inch across and having five stamens. The blooms emerge in clusters from the leaf axils.	Perennial vine. Trunk is twining stems typical of the morning glory family. It is not aggressive and is a nice size for a garden trellis.
<b>Lion's Tail or Lion's Ear</b>	<i>Leonotis leonurus</i>	Sun to part shade, fertile soil with medium moisture.	Large whorls of showy orange flowers with green fringe like lion's ears or end of lion's tail. Blooms fall and winter. Coarse leaves. Spreads through seeds. Possible humming bird attractant.	Perennial 3'-7' tall, semi-evergreen shrub.

<b>Mexican Flame Vine</b>	<i>Pseudogynoxys chenopodioides</i>	Full sun or shade. Tolerant of soil variations.	Flowers are daisy like vivid orange, deepening to red-orange in clusters. Blooms in Spring and Summer. Once plant is established it thrives with little attention.	Perennial, evergreen, self supporting vine, 15'-20'x3'-5'.
<b>Mexican Tarragon</b>	<i>Tagetes lucida</i>	Full sun, well drained soil	Anise flavored leaves, yellow flowers, up to 2 feet tall, best reproduction in Fall	Perennial in South, cold sensitive
<b>Mrs. B. R. Cant Tea Rose</b>	<i>Rosa x 'Mrs. B. R. Cant'</i>	Well-draining soil, full sun	Antique (1901) rose with big double dark silvery pink, fragrant rose prolific bloomer, drought and heat tolerant disease resistant, prune sparingly.	Shrub 8' high and 8' round
<b>Muhly Grass</b>	<i>Muhlenbergia capillaries</i>	Moist, open sites in full sun, light shade	Pinkish foliage, attractive all year round. Robust, clump forming perennial grass.	Size varies from 1-4 feet, best flowering in autumn.
<b>Obedient Plant</b>	<i>Physostegia virginiana</i>	Full to partial sun, moist to average conditions	Member of the mint family, white or lavender flower spikes. The flower has no sent, bumblebees are the most important pollinators of the flower.	Perennial grows 24-48" tall, blooms late summer into fall. Plant got its name because you can bend the individual flowers in any direction
<b>Plumbago</b>	<i>Plumbago auriculata</i>	Grows best in full sun on well-drained soil. Many uses. Low border hedge	Flowers grow in blue or white clusters, Flowers bloom most of the year. Drought-tolerant blue varieties have stronger blooming stems.	Evergreen woody shrub, Height 3'-5' with a spread 3'-4'
<b>Polyantha 'Sweet Pea' Rose</b>	<i>Rosa 'sweet pea'</i>	Well drained soil in full sun	Antique rose which blooms continuously with 1" blooms fragrant mauve to lavender color. Prune 1/3 each Spring. Remove all dead branches.	Perennial, low hedge or small border plant of 2'-3' high.

<b>Scarlet Milkweed</b>	<i>Asclepias curassavica</i>	Sun or part shade. Butterfly-attracting plant found in sandy fields, damp meadows and garden soils.	Named for its milky sap, with bunches of orange, yellow, and red tubular flowers. Nectar source for bees and other insects and a larval food for the monarch butterfly.	A herbaceous perennial growing 2'-3' ft. high. Reseeds freely and blooms all year.
<b>Seaside Goldenrod</b>	<i>Solidago sempervirens</i>	Florida native grows best in full sun to light shade, grows in dry to damp soils.	Spikes or clusters of small, yellow, aster like flowers atop tall leafy stems. They spread from underground runners so they may need to be contained.	Perennial wildflower, up to 6' tall, blooms all year.
<b>Society Garlic</b>	<i>Tulbaghia violacea</i>	.Full sun, cold and drought tolerant; used in irrigated landscapes.	Low growing, clumping herb spreading by rhizomes. Lavender spike flowers bloom year round. Garlic smell to foliage.	Perennial herb used as groundcover or border, 1-2' tall
<b>Starry Rosinweed</b>	<i>Silphium asteriscus</i>	Full sun, drought tolerant	Yellow blooms, blooms year round, Grows 2-3 feet. Leaves have sand paper texture.	Perennial, reseeds
